Liability and accident insurance coverage was discussed. Doug will contact other societies to learn how they handle the situation.

The barbershop was discussed. It is on concrete now, the plaster is off the walls, but we will have the cost to drywall the walls, put linoleum on the floor and put siding on the building.

The Knopf cabin will not be complete until next year. Logs have been cut and sawed, but the lumber has to dry. Dave Heise has been working on the filling station when he has time.

Once all the buildings are in place at the historical street, we will need electrical service down there. We will present the subject to the village and town to see if they would cover the expenses. We will also need to consider a security system.
